Rules & Regulations

Campus parking is a privilege, not an entitlement

1. Parking Permits will only be issued to seniors who:
 - a) have valid driver's license
 - b) can provide a copy of a current vehicle registration
 - c) fill out all necessary paperwork by the deadline*

**Students who turn in their materials after deadline will be placed on a waiting list. In the case that there are more students than spaces, a lottery will be used to assign the spaces.*
2. Student parking tags must be displayed while parking on school grounds.
3. All cars that a student may drive must be registered in the main office. Change of vehicles and or license plates should be reported.
4. Students must follow all traffic laws, speed limits, and operate vehicles in a safe and lawful manner at all times.
5. Students are permitted to park only in the student parking area in their assigned spot only.
6. Students are not permitted to go to their cars or to be in the parking lot during the school day without permission.
7. Students whose classes end before the end of 9th period may apply for early dismissal privileges through the Assistant Principal. Students may leave early only with administrative approval.
8. No student may take another student off the school grounds at the end of the school day unless there is written permission on file with the Assistant Principal from both the parent of the driving student and the parent of the passenger.
9. All students drive cars at their own risk. The school district and PVHS are not responsible for damage to cars or loss of property from cars. Any student caught damaging cars will be reported to the Putnam County Sheriff's Department and will receive the maximum school penalties as well as possible criminal charges.
10. ***Campus parking is a privilege.*** It can be suspended or revoked as a punishment for irresponsible behavior at school, including behavior that is not related to driving.
While on the PVCSD Campus, cars are subject to search and inspection.

**Consequences Related to the Violation of Parking
Rules/Regulations on Campus**

1. Any disciplinary infractions may result in a loss of student parking privileges.
Example: ISS, School Lateness, Poor Attendance, Repeat Referrals
2. If a student is failing two or more classes, they may lose their parking privileges.
3. If a student receives one or more days of OSS (drugs, alcohol, violent behavior, threats, disruptive behavior, weapons, and/or jeopardizing school safety/culture etc.) their parking privileges WILL BE suspended until further notice.
