"PV has heart, We're environmentally smart!"

At the first student community meeting of the year, on December 13, Go Green Club members Rachel Fitzgerald and Nina Azcue gave us a presentation on how recycling and composting helps our environment in many ways. The next day, the Go Green Club put two recycling bins in the cafeteria. The blue bin is for mixed cans and bottles. The green bin is for five-cent return cans and bottles. There's one more bin in the cafeteria, a compost bin. It's for left over food and food peels, anything that's decomposable.

Student Council helped raise a lot of money for the Go Green Club to buy environmentally safe light bulbs for the school. They did this by having kids in the school buy paper light bulbs for one dollar each. The school raised \$847. That is more than half of the student council's goal of \$1,500 for the year! There is also a bin in the cafeteria for extra change. The money you put in it goes to adopting acres of a rainforest in Costa Rica. Each acre costs \$50, and we protect them for one year. We've adopted seven acres so far. That's \$350!

The Go Green Club's initiative is to make our school greener. By greener we mean more environmentally aware or smart. They are working to win a competition for the greenest school. We think they're on the right track! One of their projects is collecting broken or old cell phones and empty ink cartridges. They get some money for them. If you have any of these used items, place them in the drop box outside of Mrs. Cohen's room, #204.

The Go Green Club is working hard to reach these goals, and by recycling, composting and donating ink cartridges and cell phones you can help too!



Martin Luther King Jr.





Perhaps one of the most remembered people in American history was Martin Luther King, Jr. He was a Negro against segregation. Segregation is basically the separation of a race enforced by a residence. Martin Luther King, Jr. was a leader in the Civil Rights Movement. He got involved when Ruby Bridges, the first Negro to be integrated in a southern school, was cursed at and spit at during school by other kids and their parents. Also Rosa Parks, who refused to give up her seat to a white person in the 1950's. She was then later arrested. This got Martin Luther King started on his dream to put a stop to segregation. Martin Luther King once said, "I have a dream that one day we will live in a nation where people won't be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character."

Sadly, a crazy person named James Earl Ray assassinated Martin Luther King on April 4, 1968. We celebrated his courageous life on January 15 this year. We had the day off from school on Monday the 15th. But, don't just let it go like any old day off from school. Just remember, if this man didn't take a stand against segregation through non-violent demonstrations, the U.S. might still be separated by race as it was back in the 1960's.

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
