Putnam Valley Central School District, in partnership with the YMCA of Central & Northern Westchester, will once again offer a no-fee universal pre-K program for the 2026-27 school year. The program is funded by New York State and is located behind the Elementary School.

Eligible children must be 4 years old on or before December 1, 2026, and reside in the Putnam Valley School District. With a limited number of seats available, all placements will be filled through a lottery. Applications to enter the lottery are open until December 31, 2025. Fee-based before/after-school care will be available.

Facilities Update

Our Turf and Track replacement project is complete and looks amazing. Additional summer projects have enhanced our buildings, including a new instructional space at Putnam Valley High School to support a specialized program. Additionally, an underutilized space on the second floor of the Middle School has been transformed into small group instructional spaces,

an office, and a conference room. This has allowed us to free up space that will now serve as a full-size classroom.

The voterapproved facilities capital project is also underway as we conclude the

we conclude the detailed planning and development phase of the project.



Architects have met with our school nurses, administration, and district staff to discuss priorities for the renovation of the nurse's office at PVES. Engineers have been on-site conducting design work for our geothermal and HVAC work at PVES, as well as the parking lot, retaining wall, and drainage work on the Middle and High School campus. We remain hopeful that some of the approved work can begin as early as the summer of 2026 to help avoid escalation costs.
