PVMS Celebrates 50 Years!

In September 1972, Putnam Valley Middle School opened its doors to students in grades 6 through 9. The year prior, Kindergarten classes were housed at St. Luke's Church and the Putnam Valley Grange Hall. With a K-9 enrollment of 1086, grades were on split sessions and some classes were held in portable classrooms behind the original building. It was an interesting time for the community, especially because the Commissioner of the NYS Education Department had started the process to dissolve our district




and have it annexed into the Lakeland School District. Today, the building holds approximately 500 students, and the recent renovations to the cafeteria, upgrades to bathrooms and the addition of learning spaces where the open courtyard once was are appreciated enhancements.

Laramie Project a Success!

PVHS TheatreWorks presented its 2022 Fall Drama production of The Laramie Project to audiences the weekend of November 4. The play offered enactments of wide-ranging perspectives surrounding the events leading to and following the gruesome loss of Matthew Shepard, a gay college student in Laramie, WY, in 1998. Student actors were tasked with playing multiple roles (4-8 characters per actor), an atypical challenge for performers accustomed to portraying just one character per production. The production stage crew worked seamlessly behind the scenes to create a smooth performance featuring many audio/visual demands. The cast and crew mounted a show that was meaningful and impactful, providing an honorable testament to Matthew Shepard and the numerous, ongoing causes spawned by his story.
